
## Chinese-Norwegian Project on Emission, Impact, and Control Policy for Black Carbon and its Co-benefits in Northern China (ChiNorBC)

## FINAL Governmental Workshop Report

The final governmental seminar for the ChiNorBC project was held 20<sup>th</sup> April 2023. After three years of excellent collaboration, the ChiNorBC-project has come to an end. The project has been running through the Covid pandemic with meetings on zoom every second week. It was a great pleasure to finally meet in person.

The ChiNorBC-project is jointly implemented by the Chinese Research Academy of Environmental Sciences (CRAES) and the Norwegian Environment Agency (NEA), in partnership with the Chinese Academy of Environmental Planning (CAEP), the Norwegian Institute of Public Health (NIPH) and Center for International Climate Research (CICERO), with financial support from the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The Norwegian delegation from the Norwegian Environment Agency (NEA), Norwegian Institute of Public Health (NIPH) and CICERO Center for International Climate Research landed in Beijing on 18th April in blue sky, bright sun and 28°C. The visit also marked ten years of collaboration between China and Norway on black carbon (BC). The first seminar was in December 2013.
